The sustainability and transformation plan, which has received very positive feedback so far, is currently the biggest thing on the board's agenda.</p> <p>Business Growth Board Steve Roberts gave a brief update on the Business Growth Board. Areas of focus include securing funding from the Sheffield city region for key projects such as Forge Island and delivering the Man of Steel.</p> <p>Safer Rotherham Partnership Steve Parry gave a brief update on the Safer Rotherham Partnership (SRP). Particular progress is being made in the reporting of hate crime and the SRP plan has now been published on the website.</p> <p>Children and Young People's Partnership Ian Thomas gave a brief update on the Children and Young People's Partnership, which is maturing well and overseeing the development of a children and young people's plan.</p> <p>It was agreed that a more in depth session on theme boards would be arranged for later this year</p>	Carole
