State-of-the-art extension nearing completion at Rotherham Medical Centre

Building works on a two-storey, state-of-the-art extension at Broom Lane Medical Centre is nearing completion, with 10 additional consulting rooms and a new treatment room.

Services at the practice are now being offered out of the new extension to allow for the old surgery space to be refurbished with the full extended modern facility due to be operational in March 2024. When fully completed the GP practice and Rotherham Central North Primary Care Network (PCN) will provide an enhanced range of primary care services that further support the needs of local patients.

Forge Island coming this summer

Building work has continued on Forge Island as it enters the final phase ahead of the opening towards the end of summer 2024.

There will be six independent restaurants including the Rustic Pizza Co, Casa Peri Peri, Estabulo Rodizio, Sakku Samba, Caffé Noor and Cow & Cream, as well as a landmark cinema and hotel.

Park and Ride at Parkgate

A new 268-space park and ride facility with EV car charging for the Parkgate tram train terminus is soon to be completed.

The schemes will improve bus reliability and journey times in the area by providing a more accessible route into Parkgate Shopping for residents and reducing traffic volumes on the A633, as well as access to the tram train network and a proposed new, larger capacity park and ride.

The scheme is being delivered by South Yorkshire Mayoral Combined Authority (SYMCA) with money secured from the Department for Transport's Transforming Cities Fund.
